Learning percussion is a challenging endeavor. Students not only learn to play the drums, but melodic percussion instruments as well. The emphasis in 6<sup>th</sup> grade is placed on the Snare Drum and the Marimba. These are the two main areas of percussion but have applications in many other areas of percussion as well. For instance, the techniques learned on snare drum will apply to most other drums as well and the techniques learned on Marimba will transfer to the bells, xylophone, chimes, vibraphone and even piano. While all other students are learning one instrument, we are learning two.
